AGENDA ITEMS

Welcome/Purpose

The primary function of the Advisory Group is to assist the contractor in the creation, implementation, and review of provider education strategies and efforts. Current Tasks

Welcome Tanith

Tanith Heesch, RN was introduced as the new J15 HHH Senior Provider Education Consultant. Tanith served CGS as a Reviewer/Educator for the CGS Medical Review Department, prior to joining POE, and also has many years of home health and hospice clinical experience.

POE AG Recruitment: Welcome New Members

Shasta McKee (Amedisys), Kelly Dennis (Unity Point), Pam Morgan (Visiting Nurses), and Joe Russell (WV Council of Home Care Agencies) were welcomed and asked to share what they will bring to the group. Nykesha displayed the Jurisdiction 15 Home Health & Hospice Provider Outreach and Education (POE) Advisory Group (https://www.cgsmedicare.com/hhh/education/Advisory_Groups.html) web page with the group and covered the POE AG Covenant to summarize the purpose, goals and responsibilities of members and CGS.

Feedback on Recent Education

Merri, Marlene, Dianne, Kim, and Brenda provided feedback on recent education attended. Merri thought the information was well presented; Marlene serves as the designee to attend events and share info with the front-line clinicians who can't attend. Hot topics seem to work better for those who can't attend, and 1-page publications were suggested.
